Statement of Purpose

Article I. Statement of Purpose

Section 101. Statement of Purpose

The Carolina Athletic Association (CAA) represents the student body's voice to the UNC Athletic Department and the CAA President, elected by the entire student body, serves as a member of the Athletic Council. The CAA serves as the liaison between the student body and the Athletic Department in order to voice concerns and promote varsity athletics. The CAA also aids in the development of all athletic ticket distribution policies that pertain to the general student body.

Section 102. Membership

By virtue of the student athletic fee, all duly registered students at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill are members of the CAA. The CAA does not discriminate, either in membership or selection of officers, on the basis of gender, color, race, age, national origin, religion, sexual preference, veteran status, or disability.

Section 103. Definitions

Carolina Athletic Association may also be known as CAA.

Article II. Statement of Cooperation

The Carolina Athletic Association and the Student Congress hereby affirm mutual respect for each other and the student body.

Article III. Statement of Responsibilities

- A. All appointed CAA Cabinet members shall be subject to the approval of the Rules and Judiciary Committee and a simple majority vote of the Congress members present at a regular meeting of the Student Congress.
- B. The CAA Cabinet shall be composed of the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, the chairs and vice-chairs of all committees, and all Presidential appointees.
- C. All nominations of CAA officials requiring the approval of Congress must be submitted to Congress within one (1) month after the first day of classes of the Fall Semester each year. Nominated individuals must appear before Congress within one (1) month after being nominated.

Article IV. Permanence Clause

- A. Pursuant to CAA v. Student Congress (2007), Student Congress shall have only the powers explicitly listed in Title VII, Article III and Title I, the student constitution.
